## The process in detail:

## Lead Times

Production: 30 days from when order acknowledgment is received from Costa Nova.
USA freight lead times: 3-4 weeks via container; air freight by request at customer expense ( 2 weeks).
RoW freight lead times: depending on distance. ${ }^{\star \star}$

Minimum Orders Requirements
Initial Order: 288 pieces (mixed) ${ }^{\star \star \star}$
Reorders: 144 pieces (mixed) ${ }^{\star \star \star}$
Other relevant information
Items should be ordered in full case quantities.
Lead time can be longer if no open stock is available for logo application.
All custom orders are subject to a 10\% overage or shortage based on yields.

## Logo placement standard fixed positions

To enhance the efficiency of logo placement processes, adhering to standard fixed positions can be highly beneficial. By following these rules, logos can be consistently positioned in predetermined fixed locations. This not only streamlines the process but also ensures uniformity across various applications.

## Oval or rectangular logos

Large width 38 mm to 51 mm ( 1.5 " to $2^{\prime \prime}$ )


Small width 31 mm to 38 mm ( 1.2 " to 1.5 ")


## Round shaped/ Circular logos

Large width 21 mm to 28 mm ( 0.8 " to $1.1^{\prime \prime}$ )
Small width 17 mm to 21 mm ( 0.6 " to 0.8 ")
